## FRAG: Guided walk along Devils Dyke, Near Burwell, Cambridgeshire and then a visit to Burwell Museum and Windmill

**Brief background:** Devils Dyke is a scheduled site of national importance and has a fascinating history linked to the Saxons. It is an impressive bank and ditch which is 7.25 miles long (11kms) and is wider and higher than Offa's Dyke. The guided walk along the earthworks will look at the archaeology, the surrounding landscape and the development of the area in past times.

**Location:** The earthworks is cut by the B1102 (Swaffham Prior to Burwell Road). We will meet at a small carpark on the right going towards Burwell, where the B1102 cuts through earthworks. After the first part of the walk we will then return to our cars and drive to Reach village. We will then return to the Dyke before retracing our steps back to Reach. There is a locally run hostel in Reach. Please be aware that there are no toilets on the site.

The whole of Devil's Dyke is part of Cambridgeshire's County Farms Estate and is open to the public throughout the year.

**Cost:** It's free to FRAG members unless they wish to visit the museum for which an 'entrance fee' of £4 is charged. Partners and guests of FRAG members may join but will be charged £5 in addition to the museum fee.

If you book a place and then decide not to come for any reason you must email DCW by Monday 9<sup>th</sup> October. Refunds cannot be paid after this date. If you cannot come on the day please let DCW know by phone. Contact details will be given closer to the day.

**Times:** The walk will start at 10am and will be in two parts each lasting approximately 1 hour. Those attending are free to bring a packed lunch or go into Burwell and have a meal at one of the hostels in the town or stay at Reach. The visit to the museum will start at 2pm and people will be free to wander. It's a fascinating museum and includes a windmill and a wide range of collections and outbuildings. **What to wear:** Suitable footwear and bring waterproofs. It is an open linear earthwork that can be wet and very slippery when wet! As attendees are not covered by FRAG's insurance they are advised to take out their own personal accident insurance if they so wish.
