FRAG: Guided walk around Stonea Camp, March, Cambridgeshire and then a visit to March Museum

Date: Saturday 9th September Organiser: David Crawford-White

Brief background: Stonea Camp is a scheduled site of national importance and has a fascinating history linked to both the Iceni tribe and the Romans. Possibly linked to Queen Boudicca the site itself stands on a gravel island just two metres above sea level. The guided walk around part of the site will look at the archaeology, the surrounding landscape, the camps demise and the rise and fall of the impressive Roman Stonea Grange built adjacent to the site.

Location: The site is few miles east of March, Cambs. The site car park is found at the end of a long metalled trackway which is signposted 'Stonea Camp' off the B1093 (Wimblington to Manea road). It is part of Cambridgeshire's County Farms Estate and is open to the public throughout the year. Please be aware that there are no toilets on the site.

Cost: Its free to FRAG members unless they wish to visit the museum for which a 'donation' of £2 is charged. Booking a place is open to FRAG members from NOW (1st June) until Friday 1st September on a first come basis. Payment will need to accompany any completed booking form. Unfortunately, dogs are not allowed as the site is used to graze sheep all year.

If you book a place and then decide not to come for any reason you must email DCW by Monday 4th September. Refunds cannot be paid after this date. If you cannot come on the day please let DCW know by phone. Contact details will be given closer to the day.

Times: The walk will start at 10am at the site car park and will last approximately 1.5 hours. Those attending are free to bring a packed lunch or go into March and have a meal at one of the many hostels in the town. The tour of the museum will start at 1pm and will last approximately one hour. It's a fascinating small museum with some finds from the Excavations at Stonea Grange. What to wear: Suitable footwear and bring waterproofs. It is an open site and can be wet and very windy! FRAG: Guided walk along Devils, Near Burwell, Cambridgeshire and then a visit to Burwell Museum and Windmill

Date: Sunday 15th October Organiser: David Crawford-White

Numbers: Limited to 20 Start time: 10am

Brief background: Devils Dyke is a scheduled site of national importance and has a fascinating history linked to the Saxons. It is an impressive bank and ditch which is 7.25 miles long (11kms) and is wider and higher than Offa's Dyke. The guided walk along the earthworks will look at the archaeology, the surrounding landscape and the development of the area in past times.

Location: The earthworks is cut by the B1102 (Swaffham Prior to Burwell Road). We will meet at a small carpark on the right going towards Burwell, where the B1102 cuts through earthworks. After the first part of the walk we will then return to our cars and drive to Reach village. We will then return to the Dyke before retracing our steps back to Reach. There is a locally run hostel in Reach. Please be aware that there are no toilets on the site.

The whole of Devil's Dyke is part of Cambridgeshire's County Farms Estate and is open to the public throughout the year.

Cost: It's free to FRAG members unless they wish to visit the museum for which an 'entrance fee' of £4 is charged.

Times: The walk will start at 10am and will be in two parts each lasting approximately 1 hour.
